Covered Recipients

You are now considered a "covered recipient" under the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Open Payments Program. The program was designed to create a more transparent and accountable healthcare system. Open Payments is a federally mandated program that collects and reports payments from **reporting entities** to **covered recipients**. Physicians and teaching hospitals, such as Children's, have been covered recipients since 2013.

Reporting Entities

Reporting entities include pharmaceutical and DME companies. These entities are required to report to CMS any payments or transfers of value given to covered recipients.

When and how will this data be published?

CMS reports the recipient's name and the payment data on their website by June 30th of each year. If you are a PA, NP, CNS, CRNA or AA, and receive a payment in 2021 from a reporting entity, it should be published on the CMS website (<u>https://openpaymentsdata.cms.gov/</u>) by June 30, 2022.
