**General Considerations**



Here are a couple of things to remember about Central Venous Access Devices (CVAD)....

- They are commonly called a central venous line (CVL).
- The device is placed in a large central vein for various infusion purposes.
- The tip of the device is advanced to the inferior or superior vena cava (depending on insertion site).
- They are acceptable for short term or long term use


