

# Straight Cathing for Urine Collection





Today I am going to have a straight cath.

A straight cath is a bendy tube that will help remove urine, or my pee, from my bladder.



Before I get my cath I will need to take off my pants and underwear.

I can keep my hospital gown on.




I will then lay on my bed.



My nurse **may** ask me to sit like a frog or a butterfly.


This means I will place the bottoms of my feet together like this.



Next the nurse will clean the area where my pee comes out 3 times with brown soap.


The soap may be on a soft cotton q-tip or cotton balls.

This may feel wet on my skin. This helps get rid of any germs that may be on my skin.



The nurse will then place the bendy tube into the opening where my pee comes out.

My job is to stay very still.



This may feel uncomfortable to me at first.

I can take deep breaths to stay calm and relaxed.



After the bendy tube is in the right place pee will drain out of my bladder into a bottle like this.

The doctors can then learn more about my pee and if my body needs any medicines to feel better.

**All done**



After the bendy tube is removed I will be all done.



I am going to do great!
